**TIME WORK**

**2024B: Building Relations for Social Cause**

**AIMS** (Association of Indian Management Schools) Week celebrated from August 1-7, 2019 on the theme **Shiksham: Building Relations for Social Cause**. Various activities such as rally for polystyrene free India, save water, traffic rules awareness and traffic management, distribution of clothes and other required material in slum areas, celebration of Friendship day in school for street children and laptop parents, fest with underprivileged children school, plant parenting and soil balls training, awareness towards prevention of food waste and grocery distribution and blood donation were organized. The main aim of these activities was to inculcate the sense of social responsibility, to feel the joy of giving to the weaker sections of society, to encourage the equality among all the sections of society.

**202C: Traffic Management and Traffic Awareness**

**Campaign** was organized from 1-12 August, 2019, scheduled from 10:00 to 11:00 every day. The event venues were **Maharaja Park and Pooji Kashi Square, Indore**. The total 30 groups were formed for each square. 100 students participated in the campaign with 7 faculty coordinators on each square daily. People were requested to drive with safety and precautions. **202G: Reading with Special People**

Students visited **'The Welfare Association of Disabled'** on 2 August, 2019 situated at **MH-40 Indore**. This association belongs to school for blind, dumb and physically challenged students. The **book drive** for **'Students'** was organized through the donation contributed by students, faculty members and non-teaching staff of the institution. **Around 30 students (20 PM) along with five faculty members visited the place.** The students served food to the children and played various games with them. At the end students distributed gifts to the children which included notebooks, pens, pencils, crayons and packets of biscuits.

**202K: Plant Parenting and Soil Balls Training**

was organized in institute campus on Saturday, 3 August, 2019. The purpose was to develop a sense of social responsibility to grow plants through plantation and plant parenting. Authorities of Forest Department, Indore Municipal Corporation advised that the plants will be taken care of not only by the institution but also by participating families, as one of the family members. The authorities supplied 20 plants without charging anything from the institution. **Mr. Rishabh Begam and Mr. Ranjan Singh** from the group **'Students for Green Prakash'** visited the institution and trained the students regarding preparation of soil balls and baskets and usage of soil balls. With the help of village authorities the students planted the trees in **Rangwasi village.**



**2019-20** : **Field to Bloom** (Wall of Education) Initiative strongly believe that basic learning facilities play a critical role in providing stability to poor families. When families lack it, there are terrible consequences. The Field to Bloom was set up at the front gate of the institute. Clothes, winter wear, footwear, caps for kids etc. were donated for deprived and poor people. The needy parents by also took the things as per their requirements. The remaining things were donated in the slum area located near Chander Nagar, Indore. It was the best teaching experience for student volunteers and faculty members who visited slum area and brought happiness on the faces of deprived people.

**2019-20** : **Awareness for Reducing Food-waste** (Waste-noting Surplus Food). A seminar on awareness on prevention of food wastage was organized on 4 August, 2019. The speaker was Mr. Anil Tripathi, area manager of Jai Chembath and founder of Rubia Food Army India, which is also active in Ghogaal, Bhopal, Ujjain and many other cities. Food-wastage is a global problem. The Rubia Food Army is a volunteer based organization that works to get surplus food from restaurants to the less fortunate portions of society in cities across India and 12 other countries. Students and faculty members joined hands with Rubia Food Army by contributing 25 kg rice and 20 kg pulses that will be distributed among the needy ones.



**2019-20** : **A Step towards Environmental Awareness** (Visit to Jyoti-McColligan Centre for Sustainable Development). One of the activities conducted under this theme was "Sustainable - A Step towards Environmental Awareness" conducted for the students on 4 August 2019. The students were greatly inspired with the interesting exhibits at the centre. All the visitors including coordinators and students were pleased to meet Professor Dr. Jyoti Pata McColligan, Director of the centre. Dr. Jyoti Pata informed the students about the usage of water saving for the purpose of daily cooking. She also told about other products which are used for increasing solar electricity such as systems, solar glasses and solar lanterns. She also made the students aware of harmful effects of using plastic material. A demonstration was also given regarding solar production.

**2019-20** : **Special Moments with Socially Challenged** (Visit to School of Street Children and School for Children of Leprosy affected Parents). A donation (Quality towards upliftment of underprivileged people of society) was conducted on August 7, 2019. The aim was to connect these people to the main stream of society so that they can also get equal opportunities to grow and thrive life. Students visited Government Annapurna Centre, Babel Road Indore and NSEP (National Education Equality Village, a school for students from slums near Kojura Temple, Indore. 40 school bags, refreshments including paperpens, stationery were distributed at NSEP. The activities such as recitation of the story and poem reciting were enjoyed by the students. Water bottles, lunch boxes and crayons were also distributed.

**2019-20** : **Blood Donation Camp**. A recycling celebration concluded with Blood Donation Camp on August 7, 2019. ## Seminar on Water Conservation

To create awareness on the benefits of water conservation and a very big problem that has to be taken care of immediately that is declining sources of water in the country, there is a need to conserve more water as we present only 5 per cent of minerals is being conserved. In this regard Institute celebrated 'Jal Diwas', a collaborative effort of Institute Institute Interface Cell (IIC) and IIS, under the Indian government's 'Jal Shakti Abhiyan', an awareness on water conservation and its various techniques on Monday, July 22, 2019. Water Treatment Specialist and Project Head of Nigrahi Charitable Trust, Indore Mr. Surabh BMS was the chief guest. He spent 26 years in this field. By sharing his experience of water conservation, expert said that availability of drinking water is decreasing rapidly, unless people used to get ground water at 100-200 feet under the ground now the level has decreased to 500-1000 feet. The water below this level is full of chemicals which causes various health problems.

He added that now the necessity of plantation, rain water harvesting and proper mechanism of water is essential. If minerals is tapped by every household, the water crisis can be avoided. If people build large underground water storage tanks to harvest rainwater, it could also recharge groundwater. So in order to conserve our water scarcity, it is important to begin efforts for conservation, innovation, exchange and reuse of water. Director Dr. George Thomas (in picture) on how people waste water wherever every area of Indore where people don't give a single drop and Indore go for away over 5 km to fetch water to start their day to day work. Therefore, it is high time to get ready to save water.

## Poster Making Competition

Inaugurated 'Jal Diwas', under the Indian government's 'Jal Shakti Abhiyan' by organizing a poster making competition on the theme of "Water Conservation" on Monday, July 22, 2019 to provide students a channel so that they can convert their feelings into messages.
