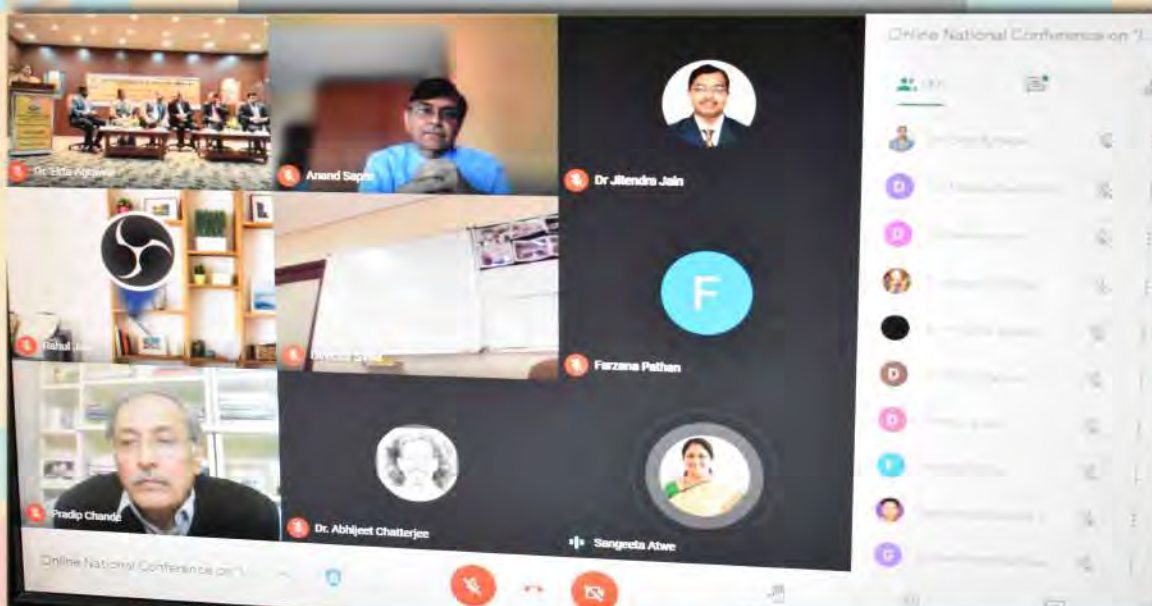

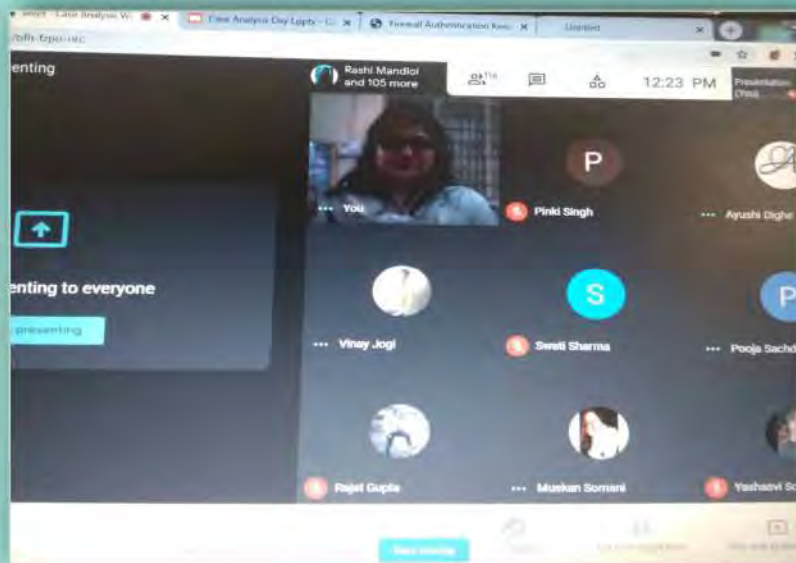

Statistics released by the State Crime Records Bureau (SCRB), M.P. reveals that Indore has recorded the maximum number of road accidents deaths every year since 2011. The campaign of Road Safety Awareness initiated by the institute on January 21, 2021 at Chanakyapuri Square aiming to reduce the current statistics of road accidents in Indore city. 18 students from different programmes were selected for this campaign.

This initiative created the awareness to wear helmets and seatbelts and also to ensure safe road crossing by insisting pedestrians to follow rules. During this campaign, students guided civilians for importance of following the traffic signal. Students also focused on drunken driving by highlighting the risks associated with it. People who broke traffic rules were requested to follow road safety measures by giving them roses and chocolates. The campaigners carried placards highlighting the importance of road safety and fatal risks caused by vehicles. During the campaign Mr. Sunil Sharma, DSP, traffic police Indore and his team were also present on the square with students. The variety of educational banners, safety posters, pocket guides and leaflets related to the road safety were distributed to people. Dr. Jagdish Sharma & Dr. Jitendra Jain coordinated the activity.

On the occasion of National road safety month (January 18 to February 17, 2021), institute organized Road Safety Awareness program in collaboration with Traffic Police Indore Team in the college premises for students of all programmes on February 13, 2021. The Program started with formal welcome of traffic police team members Mr. Sunil Sharma, DSP, Traffic Police Indore, Mr. Rakesh Sharma, Coordinator Road Safety Program, Traffic Police Indore and Mrs. Aarti Mourya, CSO, RI Group, Traffic Police Indore. 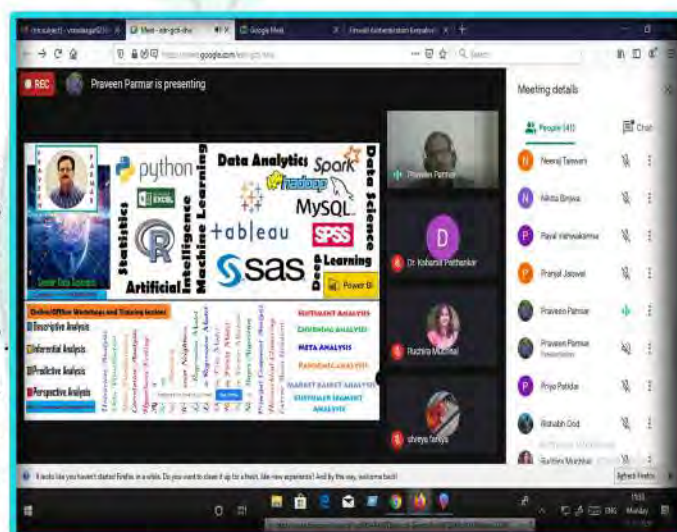

Online Workshop on 'Models Creation using R'

Data science is an inter-disciplinary field that uses scientific methods, processes, algorithms and systems to extract knowledge and insights from structured and unstructured data and apply knowledge and actionable insights from data across a broad range of application domains. To make students acquainted with emerging trends in technology, Department of Computer Science organized an online workshop on December 21, 2020 for BCA III Year students on 'Data Science'. The objective of this workshop was to make students understand and learn the 'Models Creation using R' in Data Science. Mr. Praveen Parmar, Senior Data Scientist and Consultant Analyst (Domain) was the expert of the Online Workshop.



The expert substantiated the difference among the three basic terminology used in Data Science, namely, Statistics, Data Analytics and Data Science. He further elaborated that Statistics sometimes hide some important details of the data which can be uncovered by applying Data Science techniques. Mr. Parmar also introduced 'Machine Learning' and 'Artificial Intelligence' concepts. The session was majorly focused on 'Linear Regression and Logistic Regression'.



After the workshop, there was a questionnaire session. The workshop was very useful and knowledge gaining for the students as they learned a lot in the area of Data Science. 42 students attended the workshop. The workshop made students aware about the art of analyzing and working on data and big data to get fruitful information. The program was anchored by Ms. Ruchira Muchshal. The workshop was well executed by faculty coordinators Dr. Priyanka Solanki and Dr. Kamalesh Malpani.

Webinar on Semiconductor Devices & Advanced Technology

A semiconductor device is an electronic component that relies on the electronic properties of a semiconductor material for its function. Semiconductor devices have replaced vacuum tubes in most applications. Students asked many questions and Dr. Singh solved their queries very patiently.

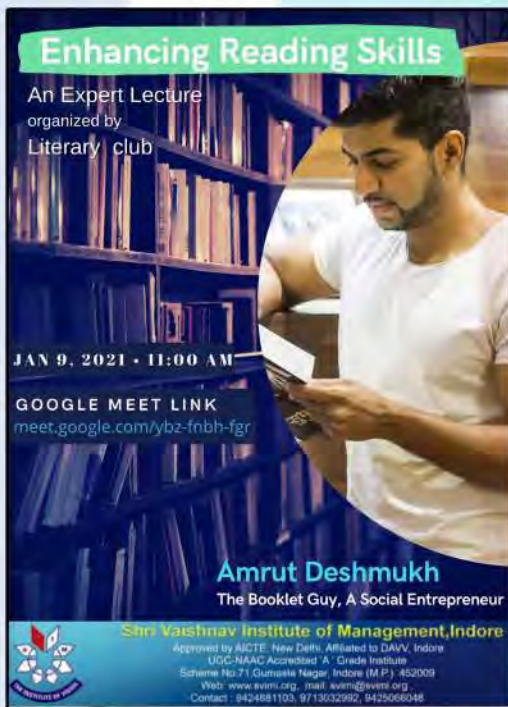

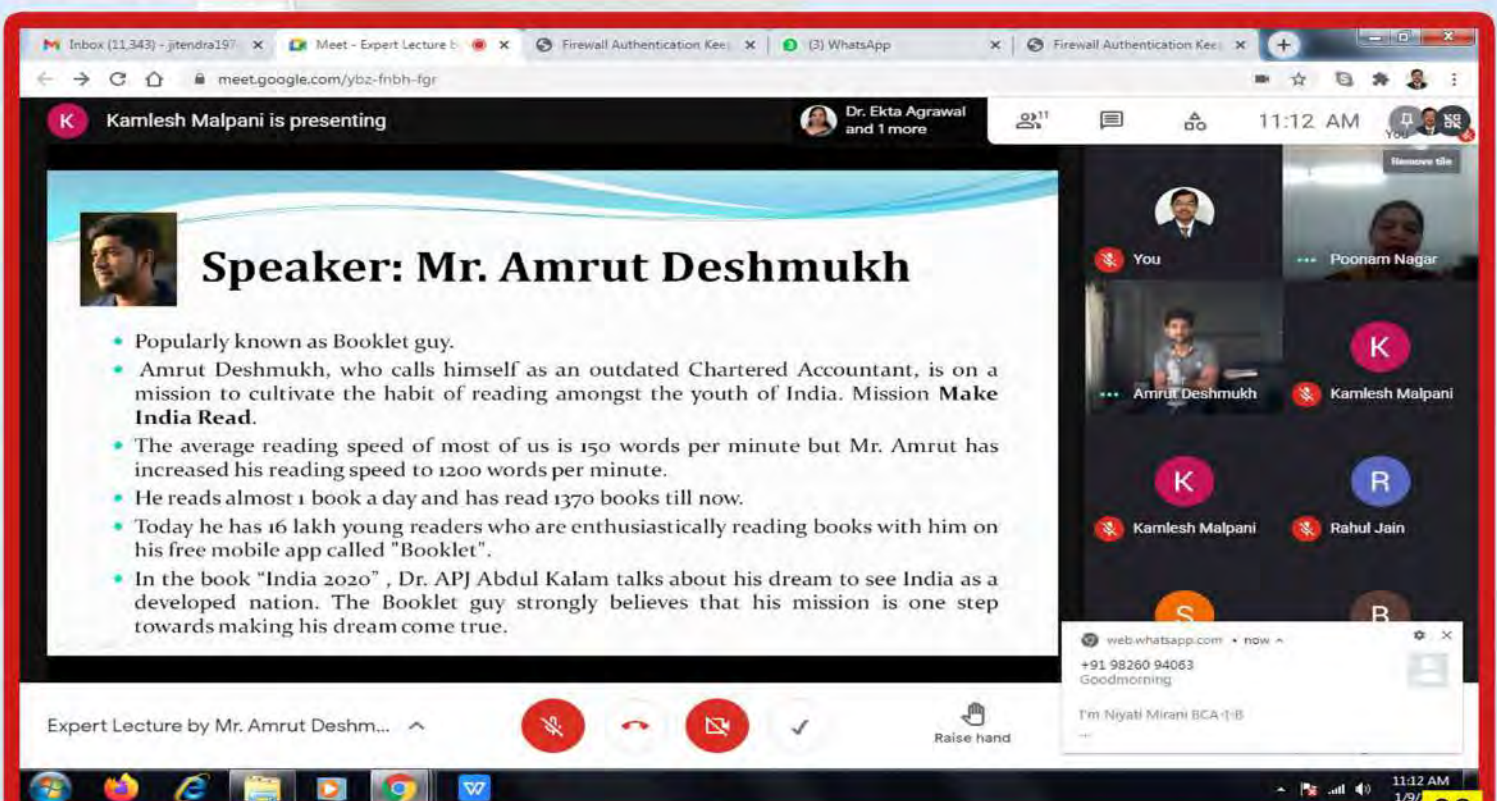


CREATIVE WRITING SKILLS

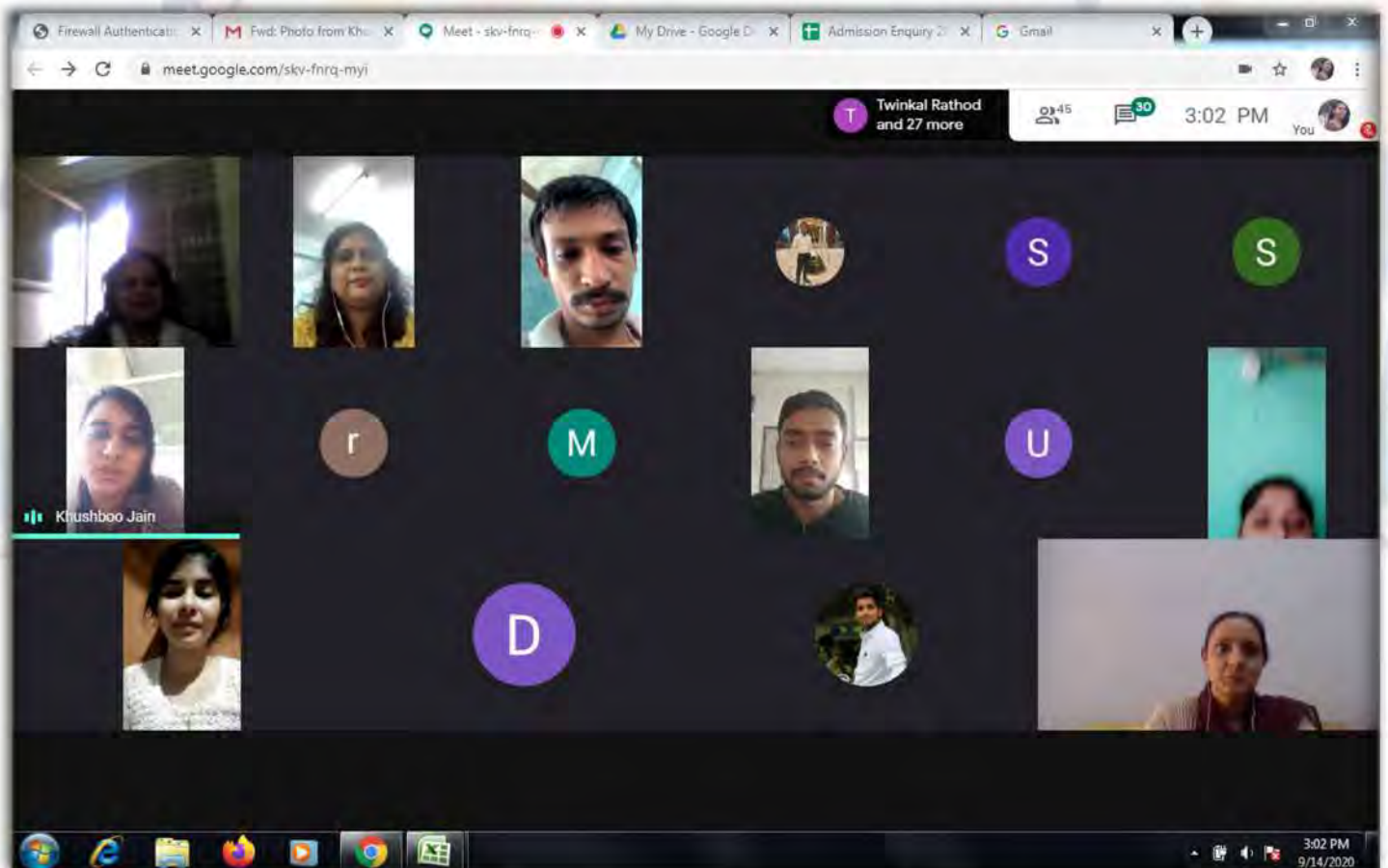
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HR Club Activity

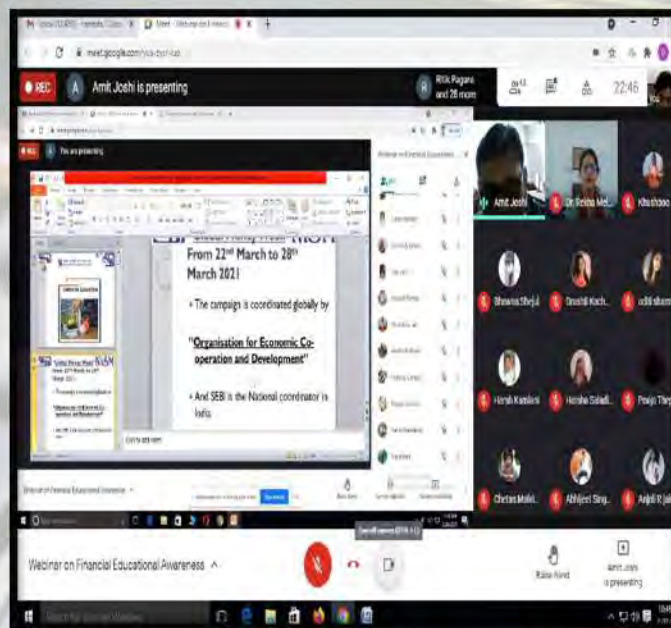
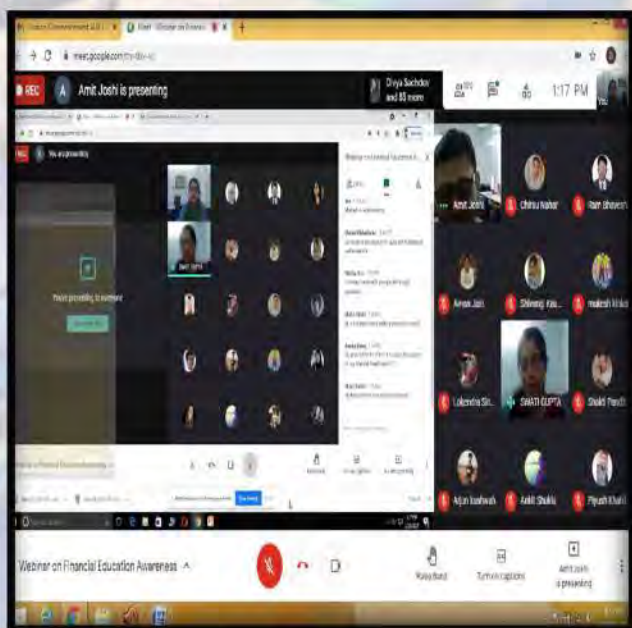

HAPPY Women's DAY

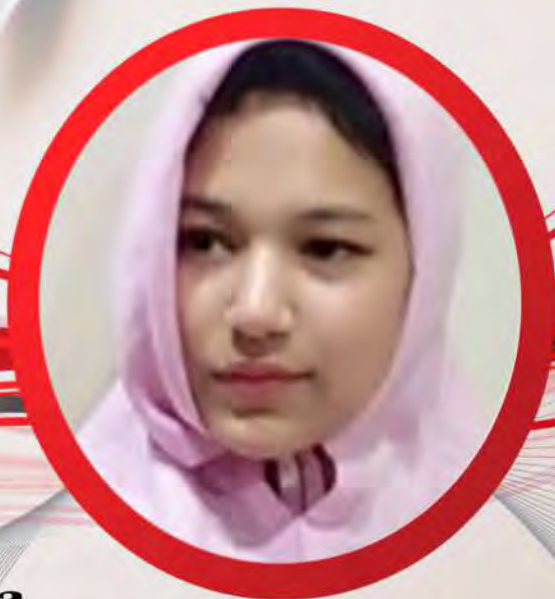
